

BARN PRACTICES AND MEDICATION POLICY

- Urination in or near a horse's stall is strictly prohibited.
- Caffeinated beverages are not permitted in areas where feed is prepared or where horses are handled.
- All persons are expected to wash their hands with soap and water:
 - Before contacting any horse's nose or mouth
 - After handling medication for a horse
 - After taking any personal medication
- Water buckets should only be used to provide water for horses. Water buckets should not be used to rinse hands, dose syringes, clean coffee mugs or drink containers, or anything else.
- Feed buckets should only be used to provide feed for horses. Feed buckets should not be used to rinse hands, dose syringes, clean coffee mugs or drink containers, or anything else.
- Gloves should always be worn if fillies or mares are receiving Regumate (altrenogest).
- Medications may only be given as authorized and only by those staff authorized to administer them.
- Medications should be labeled and stored properly and separately from feed areas, scoops, carts, or any other shared equipment.
- Monitor owners and other guests to make sure they do not accidentally provide horses any treats that may contain prohibited substances (poppy seed bagels, chocolate donuts, etc.).
